MILLS TO LET.

To be let, for such Term of Years as shall be agreed upon, with or without a toties quoties Covenant for Renewal, the Mills of Athgarvan, adjoining the River Liffey, near the Curragh of Kildare, with seven Acres of Ground contiguous, and fifteen Acres more if required, which are constantly supplied with Water.

Proposals to be made to Thomas Twigg, Esq; Merrion- Square, Dublin.

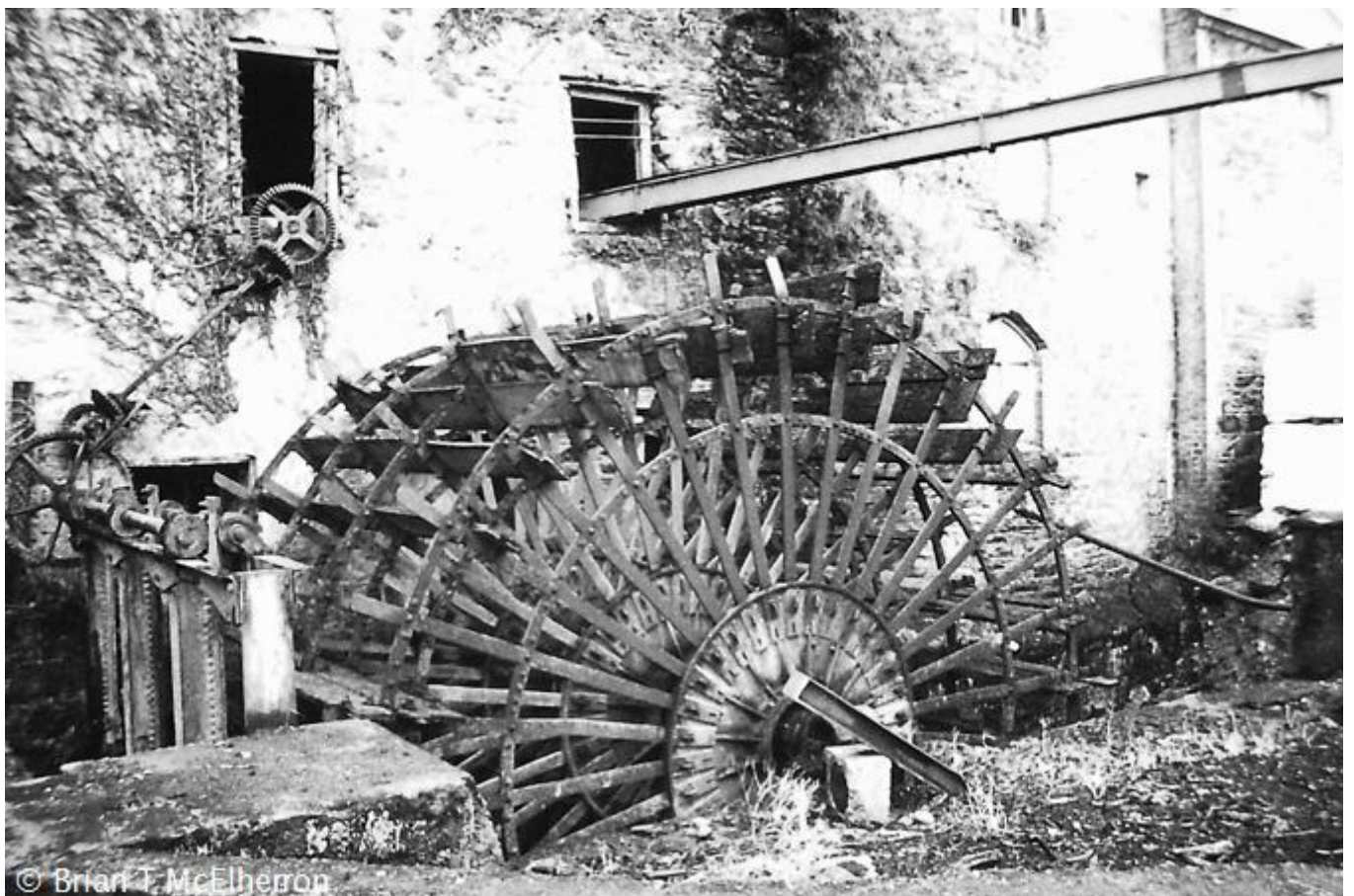


The earliest definite reference to a mill at Athgarvan comes from the Noble and Keane map of County Kildare of 1752. The mill is also marked on Alexander Taylor's map of County Kildare of 1783. The existing Malthouse dates back to between 1840 and 1880.
