

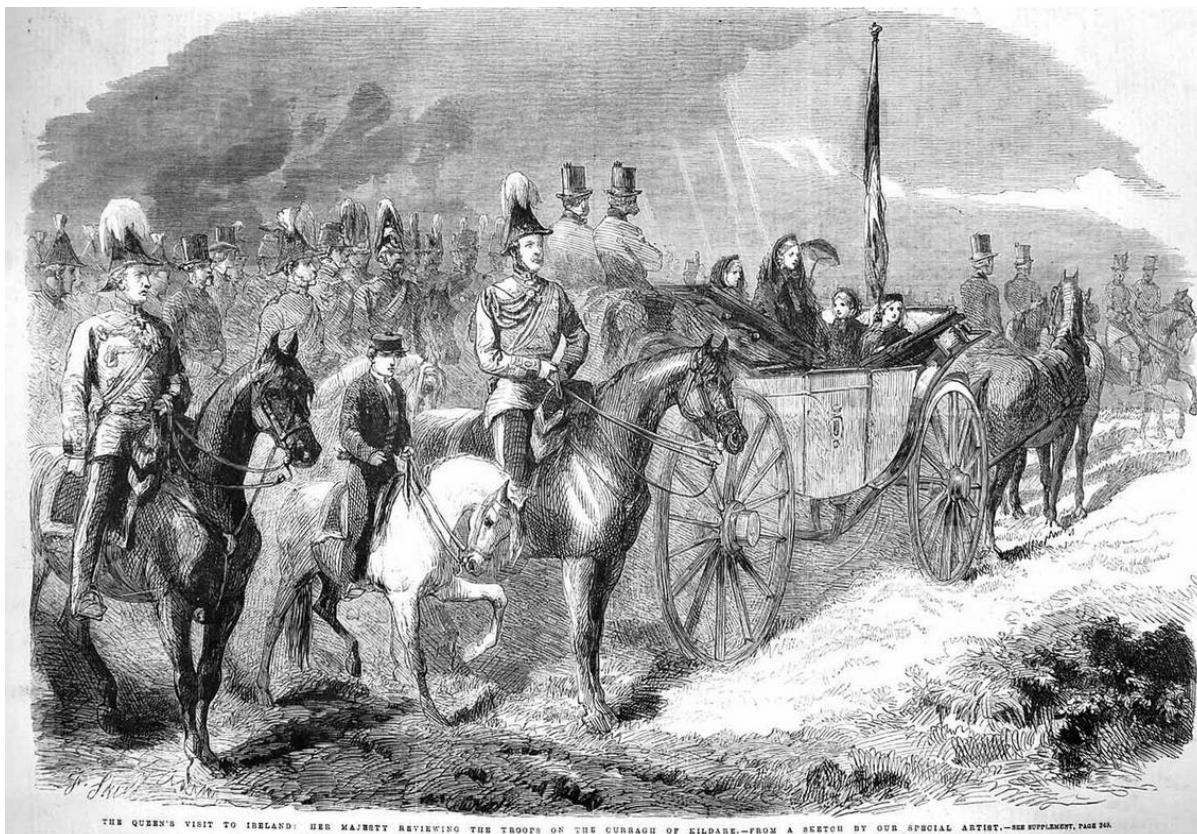
# GRAND REVIEW AT THE CURRAGH 21<sup>ST</sup> AUGUST 1861

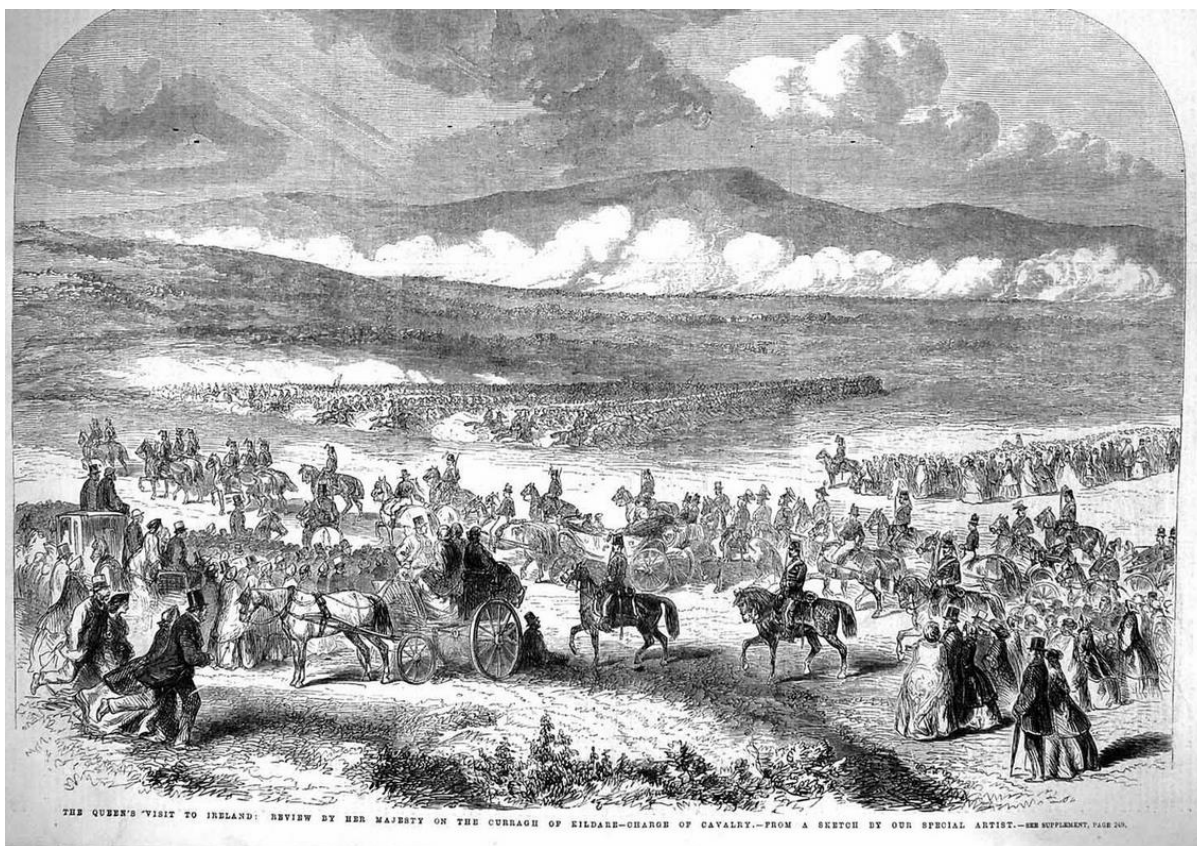
A grand review was held yesterday at the Curragh, at which his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales was present. About eleven thousand men were on the ground under the command of Lieutenant-General Sir George Browne. Preparations for the grand review to be hold before her Majesty on Saturday are being made, and the troops from several districts in Ireland will arrive this night and tomorrow. Full twenty thousand men will be under arms at the Curragh on Saturday next.
