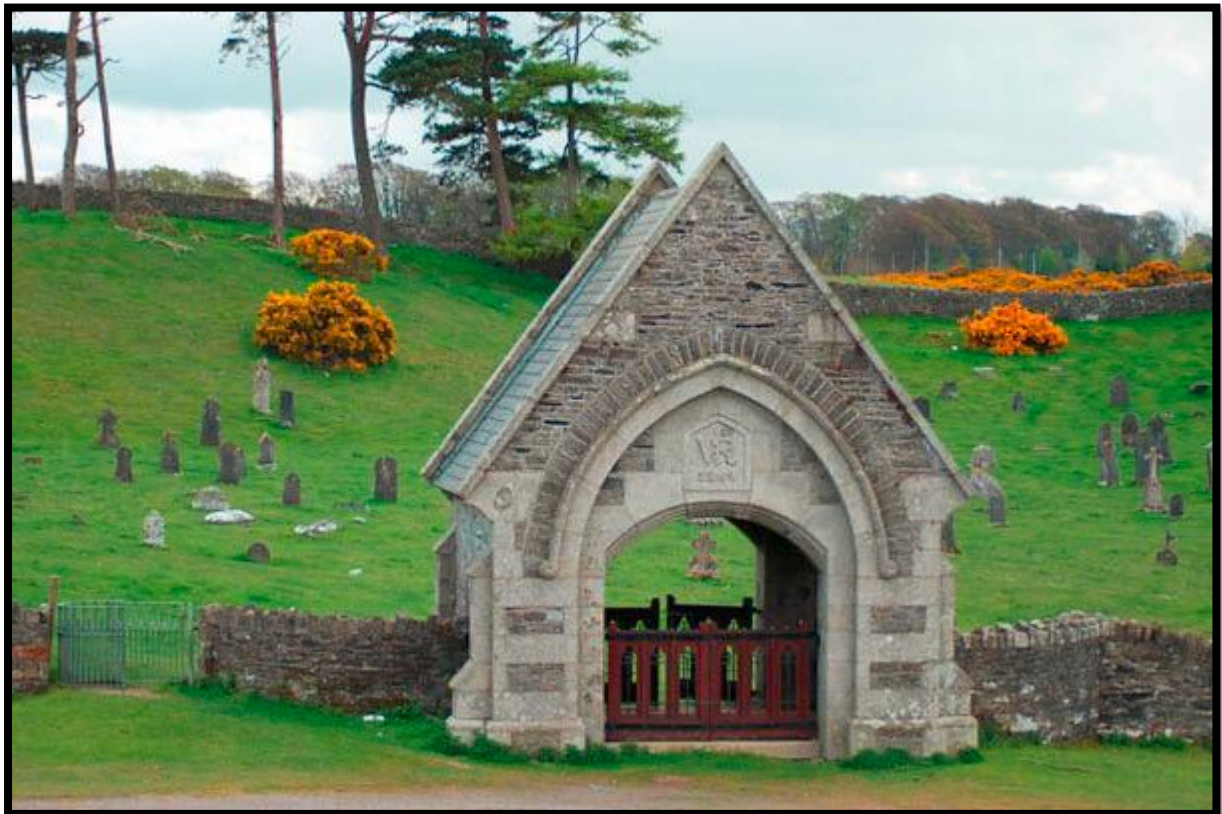

NEW BURIAL GROUND AT THE CURRAGH

We are informed that the War Department have decided on enclosing a burial ground exclusively for the soldiers in the Curragh. This is a thing which was much required, as a great many encroachments on neighbouring cemeteries have been made since the Camp was established, both at the grounds attached to the Cathedral at Kildare and what is known as Grey Abbey, while any of the military who died at Newbridge were interred at Great Connell. We understand a large piece of ground will be set apart, and that the place chosen is close to Donnelly's Hollow, but will not be in view of the road leading from the Standhouse to Kilcullen.



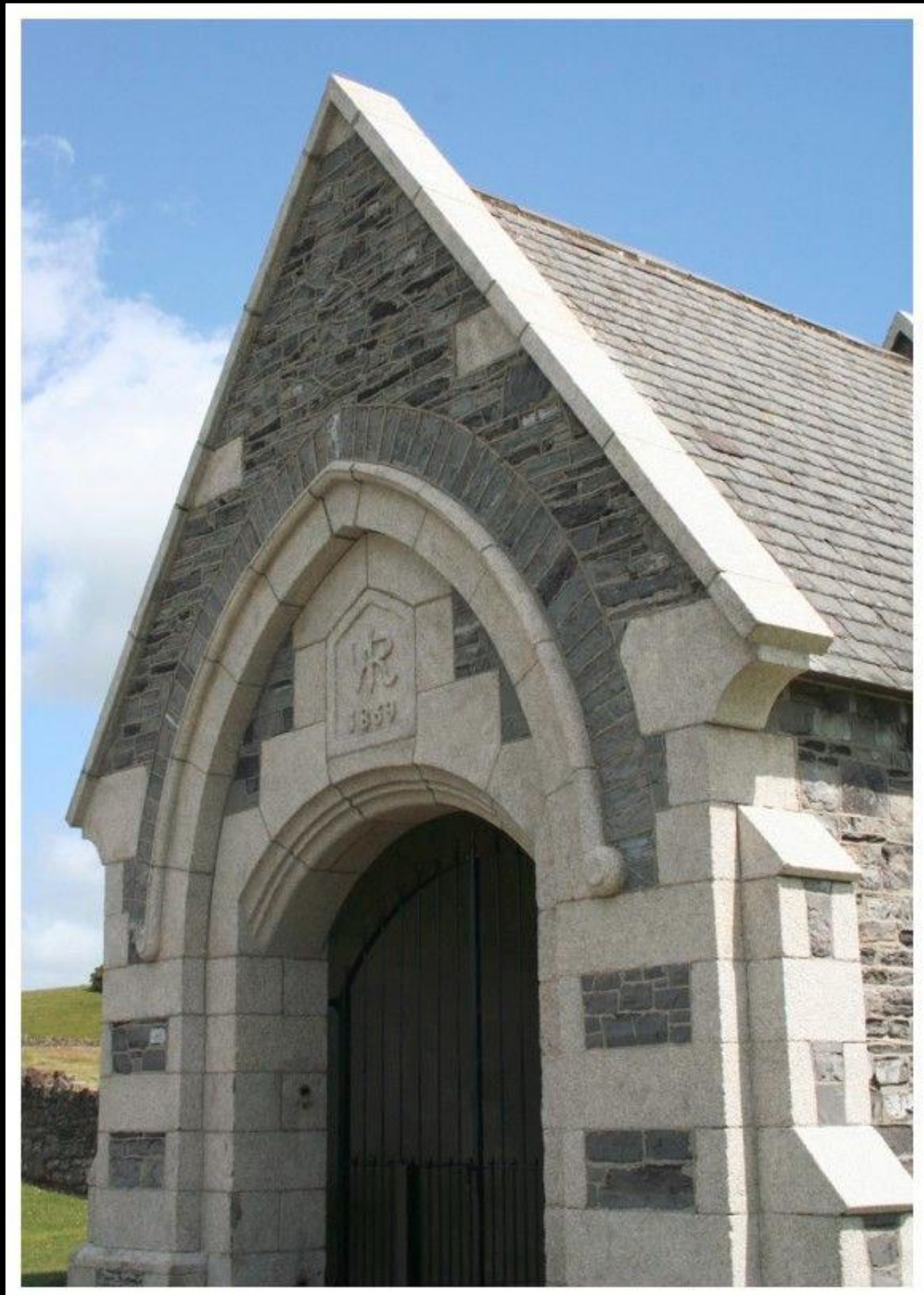
Curragh Military Cemetery, opened 1869

Curragh Military Cemetery - November 1913







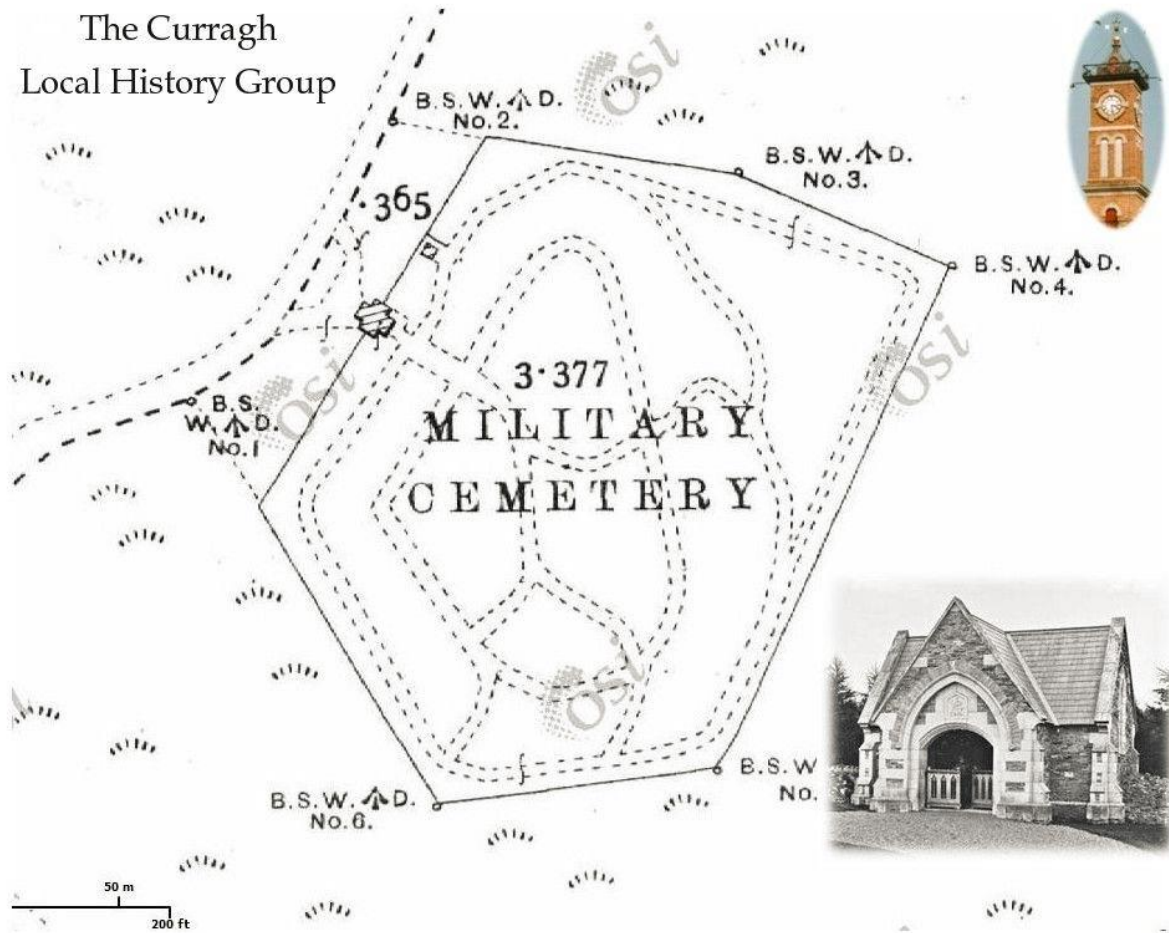
